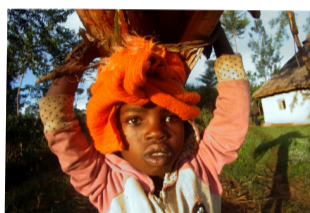
#### CLIMATE OF CHANGE

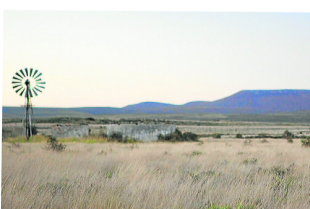


#### THE WEATHER GODS
